


## WINNINGEST BASEBALL TEAMS IN PAST 15 YEARS


### 1 TEAM WITH 10 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS, 2001-2015

The **Bishop Hendricken Hawks** ([hendricken.com](http://hendricken.com)) won State Championships from 2003-2005 and from 2008-2010 and 2012-2015. Bishop Hendricken has won the most baseball State Championships in the nation since the mid 1990's, earning 14 State Titles, one ahead of Eaton and Chaparral since 1994, and a total of 20 State Championships dating back to 1977. With an enrollment of 950, Bishop Hendricken, an all-male private Catholic school, competes in the highest classification in Rhode Island. Bishop Hendricken has had 20 players drafted, including 2 Major Leaguers. The Hawks have won nearly 88% of their games since 2001.

### 8 TEAMS WITH 8 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS, 2001-2015

The **Bishop Gorman Gaels** ([bishopporman.org](http://bishopporman.org)) won their first State Championship in 2006 and won a total of 7 consecutive State Championships through 2012, before winning it again in 2015. With an enrollment of 1,260, Bishop Gorman, a private Catholic school, competes in the highest classification in Nevada and set the state's longest win streak in history in 2009 with 35 consecutive victories and was ranked #3 nationally by Perfect Game in 2015. Bishop Gorman has had 30 players drafted, including 3 Major Leaguers. Bishop Gorman was named by Baseball America as the #1 team in the nation in 2009, and the #1 team in the nation in 2012 by MaxPreps, Collegiate Baseball, and USA Today. The Gaels have won over 84% of their games since 2004.

The **Bishop Ward Cyclones** ([bishopwardbaseball.com](http://bishopwardbaseball.com)) won State Championships in 1958, 1960, and 1983, before earning titles again in 1998 and 1999, and then won 6 consecutive State Championships from 2003-2008 and then won State Championships in 2010 and 2014. The Cyclones have won 27 regional championships, including 15 straight from 1996 to 2010. The Cyclones won 45 straight games from 2007-2008, capping off a state tournament win streak of 19 games from 2003 to 2009. With an enrollment of 330, Bishop Ward, a private Catholic school, competes in the middle classification (4A of 6A) in Kansas. Five Cyclone players have been drafted by Major League Baseball, including 3 Major Leaguers. The Cyclones have won 75% of their games since 1997.

The **Eaton Fightin' Reds** ([eatonbaseball.com](http://eatonbaseball.com)) won their first State Championship in 1994 and have now won a total of 11 State Titles, most recently in 2015, the most in the nation during that period by a public school. The Reds have 30 regional championships, including a current streak of 23 straight regional championships and final fours. The Reds have had 37 state tournament appearances, including 33 consecutive. With an enrollment of 500 students, Eaton, a public high school, competes in the middle classification (3A out of 5A) in Colorado, and has had over 75% of graduating seniors go on to play collegiate baseball over the past 20 years, including having the last 12 Major League Baseball draft selections in the county all be Eaton Reds. MaxPreps named Eaton the National Champions in 2015 amongst schools with an enrollment under 1,000, and #17 in the nation in all classifications, and ranked Eaton the #16 team in the nation (and #1 amongst schools with an enrollment under 800) at the end of the Reds' season in 2009. The Reds have won 90% of their games over the past 10 years, and 88.3% of all games over the past 25 years for the highest winning percentage in the nation during that time.

The **Farragut Admirals** ([admiralsbaseball.com](http://admiralsbaseball.com)) won State Championships in 2003, 2004 and 2006 before winning four consecutive State Championships from 2008-2011 and then again in 2014. Farragut's only State Championship before this era was in 1982. With an enrollment of 1,700, Farragut, a public school, competes in the highest classification in Tennessee and has won 17 regional championships, all since 1982, including 14 since 1996. Farragut was ranked amongst Baseball America's top 10 national teams in 2008 and 2009, and was ranked #28 nationally by Perfect Game in 2015. Farragut has had 12 players drafted, including 2 Major Leaguers. The Admirals have won nearly 84% of their games since 2008.



The **La Cueva Bears** ([lcbearsbaseball.com](http://lcbearsbaseball.com)) won 4 straight State Championships from 2003-2006, and then added another four State Championships in 2008, 2010, 2011, and 2014. La Cueva won 70 straight games from 2002 to 2005, which at the time set the highest win streak in national history (but has since been passed 3 times). With an enrollment of 2,000, La Cueva, a public school, competes in the highest classification in New Mexico and has won 18 district championships winning all but two of them since 1996. La Cueva has had 14 players drafted, including 2 Major Leaguers. La Cueva was named the #1 team in the nation in 2004 by Collegiate Baseball America. After winning only 63% of their games from 1987-1998, the Bears have won 84% of their games since 1999.



The **Owasso Rams** ([www.owassobaseball.com](http://www.owassobaseball.com)) won the State Championship in 2001, 2003, 2004, 2007-2009, and 2013 and 2015. The Rams have failed to reach the State Tournament only twice in the past 19 years, reaching the State Championship Game 16 times during that period. In 2013, Owasso finished the season 36-0 and was ranked #2 nationally by MaxPreps, and was ranked #16 nationally by Perfect Game in 2015. The Rams have had 13 players drafted by Major League Baseball, including 4 that played in the Major Leagues. The Rams have won just over 88% of their games since 2008.



The **Parkview Baptist Eagles** ([parkviewbaptist.com](http://parkviewbaptist.com)) won 3 State Championships in the 1980's, one in the 90's, and then won 5 consecutive titles from 2002-2006 before also winning State in 2008, 2009, and 2013. Parkview Baptist has won 27 district titles, including 16 consecutive. Six Eagles have been drafted, all since 1995. With an enrollment of 500, Parkview Baptist, a private school, competes in the middle classification (3A of 5A) in Louisiana. The Eagles have won 75% of their games since 2008.



The **Saint Mark's Spartans** ([spartanssports.com](http://spartanssports.com)) won their first State Championship in 1985, then another in 1988, and three State titles during the 1990's, and then have won 8 state titles this century. With an enrollment of 1,350, Saint Mark's, a private Catholic school in Wilmington, competes in a singular classification for all teams in Delaware, as there are under 30 public high schools in addition to a number of private schools in the state. A total of 11 players have been drafted from St. Mark's since 1978, including five this century, and two Major Leaguers. The Spartans have won 81% of their games since 1998.
